Money Follows the Person



ABOUT MFP

Money Follows the Person is a demonstration grant program that provides qualified individuals assistance with transitioning from an inpatient facility to a home and community-based setting.

If you are currently residing in an inpatient facility like a hospital or nursing home, MFP provides transition assistance to eligible individuals by helping remove barriers to living independently in the community.



MFP Services

MFP helps people return to the community setting of their choice with the supports they need. MFP services include transition coordination and one-time financial assistance up to \$2,500 to access needed items and services not typically covered by Medicaid.

Transition Funds cover barriers such as:

- Security Deposits
- Household Items
- Home Modifications
- Durable Medical Equipment
- Personal Items
- Utilities and Transportation

Money Follows the Person provides services and supports based on the individual needs of the participant.

Eligibility

Individuals who meet the following criteria are eligible to enroll in the Money Follows the Person Program:

- Express a desire to live in a community-based setting.
- Are a Vermont resident (18 years of age or older).
- Currently residing in a qualified inpatient facility and have been for 60 days or longer.
- Are receiving Choices for Care and Long-Term Care Medicaid at the time of transition.

Qualified Housing

To participate in MFP, you must transition into one of the following qualified housing options:

- A home that you or your family own or lease.
- A leased apartment
- A shared living housing option that provides continuous individualized supports to no more than four unrelated individuals in a family orientated environment.
